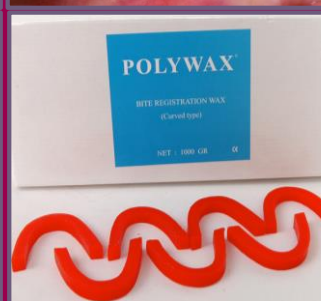
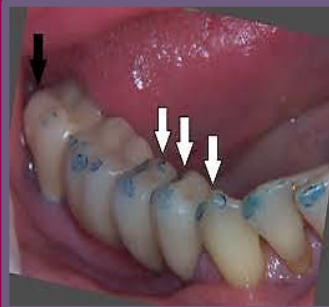


GETTING THE BITE RIGHT: A REVIEW

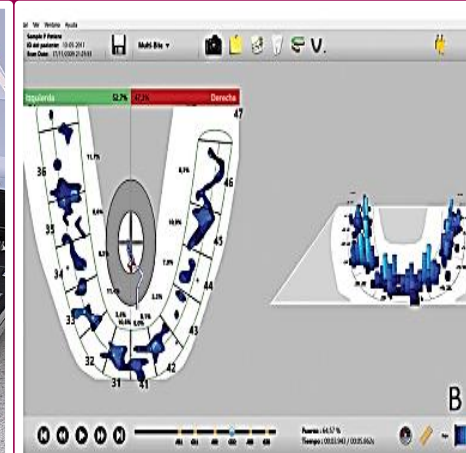
A high point in restoration is a filling which is placed too high causing unnecessary contact between the restoration and corresponding teeth

If a high point in a restoration is left untreated, it can cause issues like an uneven bite, which can exacerbate TMJ issues, trouble in chewing, etc leading to failure of the restoration. There are various non-digital and digital methods for checking high points in restorations.

Subjective Interpretation of articulating paper markings is a very inaccurate method of selecting forceful occlusal contacts for checking high points. The T-Scan system identifies the time and force characteristics of occlusal contacts, and hence, establishing true and measurable bilateral simultaneous occlusal contacts by using this system.
