WHAT IS DEEP MARGIN ELEVATION ?

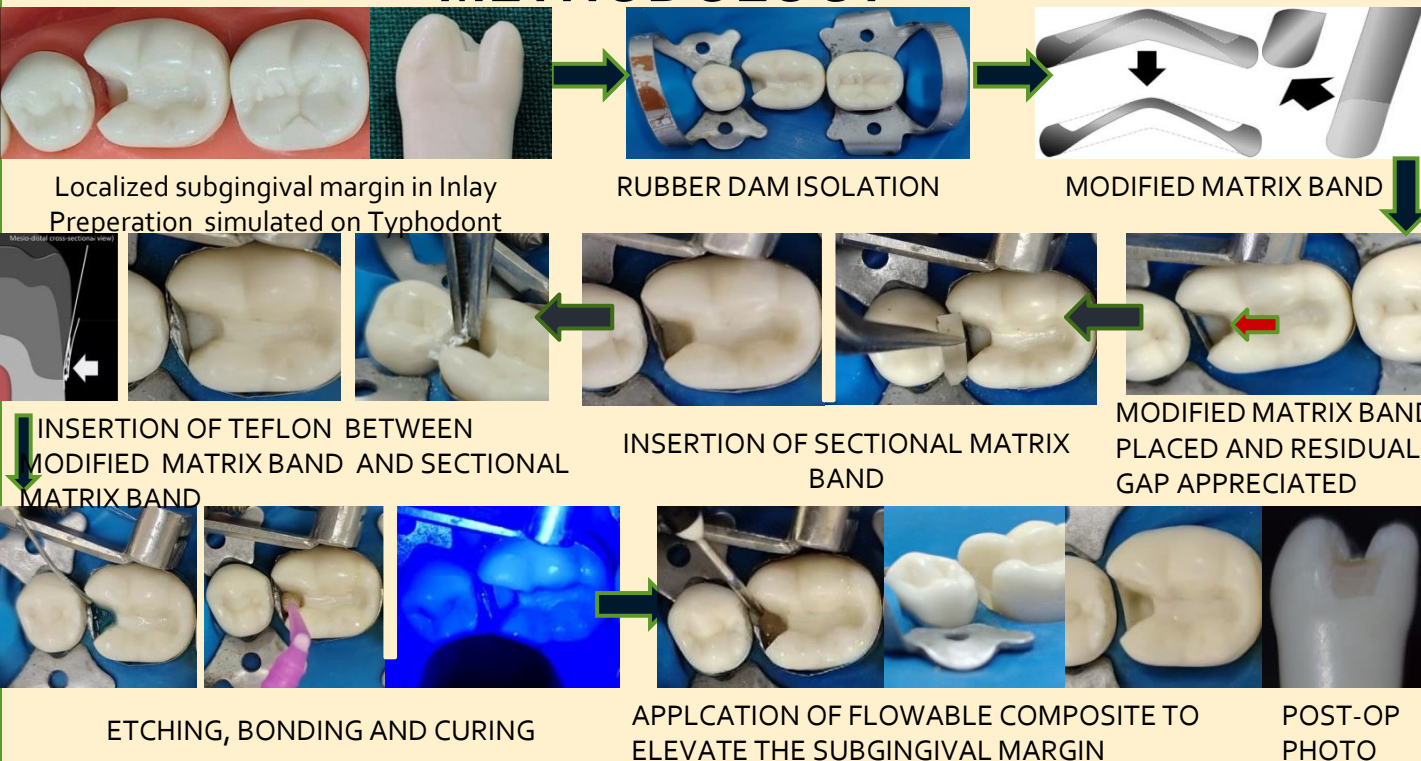
It is a procedure for supragingival relocation of deep subgingival margins, for better adaptation of the periodontium and make the restoration procedure easier.

AIM: To facilitate optimal elevation of deeper subgingival margins, thereby ensuring restorative effectiveness,, compatible with periodontal health .

OBJECTIVE :

- To demonstrate an innovative technique, the "MATRIX-IN-A-MATRIX TECHNIQUE" for Deep Margin Elevation.
- To elicitate a Minimally invasive alternative, to surgical intervention, for supragingival repositioning of subgingival margins.

METHODOLOGY



INDICATIONS :

- ❖ Extremely Deep Class-II defects with subgingival margins.
- ❖ Root concavities
- ❖ Infrabony defects
- ❖ Insufficient seal by inner matrix.
- ❖ Versatile technique

ADVANTAGES :

- ❖ Optimal emergence profile
- ❖ Favourable contours
- ❖ Minimally invasive alternative
- ❖ Improved accessibility and better isolation from blood and gingival fluid
- ❖ Ease in impression making
- ❖ Better marginal seal
